MON CRIME (THE CRIME IS MINE) FRANCE | 2023 | 102 MIN | NARRATIVE | DIR: FRANÇOIS OZON



THURSDAY FEB 22; 7:30PM Monday FEB 26; 11:45AM Paris in the 1930s: a playground for industrial heirs and debonair architects, but the City of Lights does not shine evenly for all. Struggling actress Madeleine (Nadia Terezkiewicz) and her best friend Pauline (Rebecca Marder), an unemployed lawyer, live in a cramped flat and owe five months' rent. Opportunity knocks after a lascivious theatrical producer who made an inappropriate advance towards Madeleine turns up dead. Madeleine stands trial for murder and ascends to decadent stardom, with Pauline serving as defense counsel and media circus ringmaster. A new life of fame, wealth, and tabloid celebrity awaits—until the truth comes out.



MENU PLAISIRS - LES TROISGROS FRANCE | 2023 | 240 MIN | DOCUMENTARY | DIR: FREDERICK WISEMAN



Regarded as one of the greatest food films ever made, this four-hour opus from 93-year-old legendary documentarian Frederick Wiseman takes an insider's look at a French restaurant that's held the top Michelin star rating of three stars for more than 50 years. Sumptuous and lavishly observed, the film shows the great artistry, ingenuity, imagination, and hard work of the restaurant staff in creating, preparing, and presenting meals of the highest quality.

LA SYNDICALISTE FRANCE, GERMANY | 2022 | 122 MIN | NARRATIVE | DIR: JEAN-PAUL SALOMÉ

An investigative thriller set in the world of nuclear power and corrupt politics, La Syndicaliste follows the true story of Maureen Kearney (Isabelle Huppert), the influential head union representative of a French multinational nuclear powerhouse. Fighting against government ministers and industry leaders, Maureen worked tirelessly to bring a scandal to light and defend thousands of jobs before she was violently sexually assaulted in her own home, seemingly targeted for her attempts to reveal the truth. As her attack is investigated, new elements create doubt in the minds of detectives and lawyers, and they begin to see Maureen not as a victim, but as a suspect.

DRIVING MADELEINE FRANCE | 2023 | 90 MIN | NARRATIVE | DIR: CHRISTIAN CARION

A seemingly simple taxi ride across Paris evolves into a profound meditation on the realities of the driver and his fare, a 92-year-old woman whose warmth belies her shocking past. Charles (Dany Boon) is a taxi driver in Paris, and he is having a very bad day. Enter Madeleine (Line Renaud), an immaculately groomed nonagenarian, who informs Charles that the trip today will not be a direct one. She is moving into a nursing home and would like to make some stops along the way predicting that this might be her last car ride through the city. Their ride takes them through the momentous locations of her life and their brief friendship deepens as Madeleine listens to Charles confess his own worries.

Six-year-old Cléo loves her nanny Gloria more than anything. When Gloria must return to Cape Verde to care for her own children, the two must make the most of their last summer together. A standout at the Cannes Film Festival, and having recently screened at the Sundance Film Festival, Ama Gloria exquisitely captures themes of family, separation, and the ties that bind people together from the point of view of its capricious—and expertly acted—young protagonist.

But after five years in pious seclusion, Elisabeth's fate is abruptly altered when she is summoned home to work the fields following the death of her elder sister, Innocente, whose mysterious death pushes Elisabeth to seek answers from three childhood friends—now young men with their own cravings for truth and connection. Renato (Ugo Tognazzi) and Albin (Michel Serrault) are happy that their son, Laurent (Rémi Laurent), is getting married. Unfortunately, the bride's father (Michel Galabru) is a die-hard conservative—and Renato and Albin are rather conspicuously gay. To ensure that the marriage goes off without a hitch, Albin uses his skills as a drag performer to play mom for a meeting with the in-laws. But, before long, both men learn that playing it straight isn't as easy as it seems! This classic received 3 Oscar nominations when it was released in 1979.

Through these many encounters, the specific fears, desires, and struggles of these individuals become the health challenges we all face, even the filmmaker herself.

It's love at first sight when Simon, a rising star of the Montreal drag scene, meets Olivier, the new recruit of the bar-show where Simon performs. While Simon believes he is living an electrifying love story, a toxic and destructive dynamic arises between them. At the same time, Claire, Simon's mother, a famous opera singer, returns to work in the country after a 15-year absence. Fascinated by this woman he hardly knows but whom he idolizes, Simon persists in trying to connect with her. Weakened by the failure of these two impossible loves, Simon will have no choice but to realize that he deserves better.

A 2022 Venice Film Festival selection, this portrait of the famed French filmmaker is divided into six chapters, each inspired by phases of his life's work, spanning the 40 years from his breakthrough with Breathless in 1960 to his late magnum opus Histoire(s) du cinéma. In trying to uncover the real Jean-Luc, filmmaker Cyril Leuthy sat down with Godard's many collaborators, friends and critics who have a lot to say about an eternal rebel who was still exhausting himself in the hunt for a perfect cinema, even with 140 films under his belt.





Whether working on a fiction or documentary, Makabi carries out extensive research in order to revive invisible, silent trajectories, exploring romantic relationships in films like A Laundry Day (2023) and bringing little-known figures to light, such as Paulette Nardal in "Paulette et le Clown" (2021) and Mbissine Thérèse Diop in "Notre mémoire" (2021), the story of the first African actress to be cast as the lead of a feature film, Black Girl (1966). Her films have screened at the French Cinémathèque, Film Society Lincoln Center in New York, the Vancouver Oueer Festival in Toronto, the Atlanta Film Festival, and the African Film Festival in New York. She is currently an artist-in-residence at Villa Albertine in Louisiana.


